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MAMCO is housed in a converted factory with large windows, vast rooms, and floors bearing the traces of long-gone machinery.

The largest museum of modern and contemporary art in Switzerland, MAMCO is constantly changing and evolving. It hosts three cycles each year, eschewing the classic distinction between permanent and temporary exhibitions.

In the past 30 years, MAMCO has hosted over 500 exhibitions, including major retrospectives of Rasheed Araeen, Laura Grisi, General Idea, William Leavitt, Verena Loewensberg, Mai-Thu Perret, and Kelley Walker. Over the years, the museum has built up a significant collection comprising more than 6000 works.

MAMCO welcomes around 50,000 visitors a year. The museum is open to all, running educational activities and initiatives—for adults and children alike—that seek to foster an organic relationship with the works in question.

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MAMCO is a public foundation sustained materially and financially by public authorities and generously supported by its donors and its Friends Association.

MAMCO has its roots in a collective initiative a varied program of educational activities, led by the Friends Association since 1973. The museum opened in 1994, thanks to eight founders who came together to create By donating to MAMCO, supporters have the MAMCO Foundation. Since that time, the museum has grown and developed with the support of its foundation and the public authorities, whose common goal was enshrined in a funding agreement between the MAMCO Foundation, the Canton of Geneva and the City of Geneva. MAMCO has been overseen by that group, which is known as FONDAMCO, since 2005.
